NSW Energy Saving Scheme

Gas Energy Australia arranged a workshop in early June 2016 for Association members with representatives from the Office of Environment and Heritage to discuss the new rule changes to the NSW Energy Saving Scheme. The workshop informed attendees about the impacts and opportunities for the gaseous fuels industry from the Scheme.

Previously, Gas Energy Australia had sent a submission in December 2015 to the NSW Government during their Review of the NSW Energy Saving Scheme to advocate for amendments that would allow greater participation for gaseous fuels.

The proposed amendments included the ability for fuel switching from grid electricity to gaseous fuels to generate certificates and extending eligibility to gas powered electricity generation projects.

Gas Energy Australia reported that the NSW Government has agreed to these changes which will now provide financial incentives for businesses to undertake a wider range of projects including the substitution of grid electricity to gaseous fuels for energy.

Gas Energy Australia will continue providing information to industry stakeholders on the NSW Energy Saving Scheme to ensure that the gaseous fuels industry can benefit from the Scheme and contribute to environmental and economic objectives.
