## Australian Gas Networks (AGN) - new website

## Vale - Russell Brown

It is with great sadness that we advise the passing of an industry legend and Gas Energy Australia Honorary Member Russell Brown. Russell passed away peacefully on the 7<sup>th</sup> October after a lengthy battle with cancer.

Russell was a respected leader in our gas technical community, a brilliant gas engineer and friend to the Association. Russell contributed much to the LPG industry through a range of committees, helping set the standards for our industry.

Russell had a long history in the gas industry which began with his own plumbing and installation business. In 1976, Russell began working with the Gas and Fuel Corporation as a maintenance supervisor and transferred to the LPG Department of the Gas and Fuel Corporation, Heatane Gas, in 1983. Russell's career at Elgas began in 1993, when Elgas acquired Heatane Gas and he became National Technical Projects Manager for Elgas.

Russell was a leader in both the Safety, Standards and Technical Committee and Transportation Committee and his resolute reasoning, technical insight and camaraderie will be sorely missed.
